Letter from the Vicar

Dear All,

For the Fruits of His Creation

It has been a year since I became the local Vicar. One of the main joys I have had in the past year has been trying to work the garden in order that it becomes both a sanctuary for reflection and also a place that produces good gifts. Since moving in I have planted many things, a mulberry tree, a fig



tree and various herbs and plants and trees. I will have to wait for their fruits, though the fig tree is yielding more than I had expected! I have grown, beans, carrots, parsnips and various potatoes. Now we are eating them, and they taste wonderful. However, the best yield has been from the trees that had been planted years before. We have various plum trees (Green Gauge amongst them) and they have produced vigorously along with the apple trees. The main thing that has grown though, is my love for my garden and for the majesty of life in all its glory. I love this very ancient prayer by the first Christians: 'As the grain once scattered in the fields and the grapes once dispersed on the hillside are now reunited on this table in bread and wine, so, Lord, may your whole Church soon be gathered together from the corners of the earth into your kingdom' (60-70 A.D.). The garden teaches me that sometimes we reap the fruits of other peoples labour and that as I reap, I must sow in order that we have food for the future. However, as we enter into the spirit of harvest, it gives pause for reflection of the yield of God in us. As Paul reminds us: 'Now concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to Him' (2 Thess. 2:1). Harvest is a time to think about the time of God's harvest. We also think about what it is we feed on. We are what we eat we say. A belly full of food will need filling again tomorrow. To this Jesus said: 'Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them' (Jn 6:54-6). We journey forward to that final day, that gathering in Christ, fed and sustained by His own Body and Blood in the form of bread and wine, once scattered and as His body gathered together in Him. Harvest is a time for thinking about waiting for that great harvest beyond the veil of this world. It's also a time for thinking about what we feed on our way.

MINUTES: The minutes from the last meeting held on 16th May, 2019 were duly signed as a true record of that meeting.

DATA PROTECTION: No further updates

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REPORT:

NDP Regulation 16 now complete will go for referendum by inspectors.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

1. Balance of account is £19,016.35 plus NDP grant of £1,344.60 Total £20,360.85

- 2. It was agreed to add Mr. Fellowes as a signatory at the bank. Forms had been completed but no confirmation received.
- 3. Mr. Cresswell proposed that the PC donate £150 for churchyard maintenance. Cheque duly signed.
- 4. Cheque for £2,280.00 duly signed for NC Peglar as per accepted quotation for works on the memorial.

CHURCH ROAD:

Speeding was still a problem and there had been some near misses as people crossed the road from the footpath to the church. The clerk to enquire if double white lines could be put on the road from the entrance of the village hall to the 30mph signs.

There was also a problem with vehicles over 7.5 tonnes using the road, the clerk to contact the police to see if monitoring could be carried out on a Wednesday as this was market day and to enforce the limit.

CORRESPONDENCE:

- 1. Gas inspections had been carried out. No significant readings found. Monitoring to continue.
- 2. A480 from Wyevale to roundabout at Stretton Sugwas, monitoring would take place to see if it was possible to make the road 40mph from Kings Acre to just past Veldifer Lane and 30mph on approach to the roundabout. Reports will be sent to the PC in due course.
- 3. Mr. Robinson and the clerk had met with Nick James regarding the boundary trees and shrubs to the village hall which need cutting back. Mr. James to speak to his estates people and will get back to us.

PLANNING:

- 1. Road to Sugwas Farm now completed.
- 2. Sundown Extension passed
- 3. Application received for The Turnpike for a dormer roof to be installed and change of use of part of ground floor. Now passed.
- 4. Pinston House car boot site: an appeal has been put forward against Herefordshire Council turning down the application for building 41 mixed houses. The PC had sent in objections to this application which still stands. No further information.
- 5. Application received for new entrance to the Lakes and outline planning for 9 house. PC were happy with the entrance but objected to the outline planning for the road and houses on the site as they were concerned about the finished height.
- 6. Application received for a house to be built in the garden on No 2 Sugwas Pool Cottages an objection has been returned as the PC were unhappy about the safety aspects of exit on to A438.
- 7. Report received that footing had been dug at Zaytoon but they were not in line with the approved planning application and were in front of the building line. The clerk to contact the Planning Authority.
- 8. New planning application will be coming in for the new footway from Church Cottages up to the village hall. Mr. Buchanan from Oakwrights had been in touch with Mr. Robinson regarding the new plan. They wanted to put a gravel path across the war memorial ground but as this was consecrated ground, there were objections to this. They also wanted to put an official path through the village hall car park there were objections to this as it would reduce the parking area but the hall committee were happy for people to walk through the hall car park on an unofficial basis. Mr. Buchanan would come back to Mr. Robinson when the new plans were drawn up.

WAR MEMORIAL:

Cleaning and re-lettering has now been completed.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

- 1. A request was made for a sign to be put up on the Barnfield Road asking motorists to be aware of pedestrians. The clerk to contact Mike Gill.
- 2. Complaints had been received that the garden of 14 Roman Way was very overgrown and vermin had been seen. The clerk to contact Herefordshire Housing.
- 3. There was a request for the parish map to be put in a more prominent position in the village hall so more people could see it. At present, it is located in the meeting room. A notice would be put up to say where it was so that anyone interested could go in and see it.
- 4. It was reported that the Hay Festival sign is still up on the A438. The clerk to contact Mr. Gill to get it removed.
