**Letter from Associate Minister in Charge -
Reverend Penny Littlewood**

Dear Parishioners,

Gosh I'm looking forward to August in Stretton Sugwas church! Why, well we have no less than three weddings taking place in that month alone, and another one later in the year. There has already been two, plus a Blessing with a Renewal of Vows, therefore a bumper year for our precious church, as couples make that wonderful commitment of love and support to each other within the walls of a building whose history dates back to Norman times.

When you think about it, that's an awfully long time. An awfully long time when people have been coming to hold their children before God for his love and protection; they've come to say farewell to those they have loved and they've come to be joined in Holy Matrimony because of love for one another.

Week in, week out people gather within those walls of a place dedicated to just that, love. The love of God for his people, the love of people for God and the love of people for each other - just as Jesus commanded we should.
